

## **You want to fly your pet from one of the Caucasus countries to a country in the EU?**

This is a time-consuming procedure which could require up to four months.

Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia are not EU member countries. Their citizens and pets do not enjoy the European Union right to free movement. They are also listed as areas at rabies risk. The regulations on bringing animals across their borders are therefore very strict.

Yet taking cats and dogs across the Caucasian borders is manageable. It demands only careful planning. We know how to navigate the requirements, regulations, and bureaucracy involved in pet travel and would be happy to assist you.

### **Our Support Plan**

- If not already done, we vaccinate the animal against rabies. We recommend vaccinations against other pathogens and deworming as well. We procure the animal's passport issued to the owners name with chip number and vaccination stamps. Please make sure that your pet is not younger than 12 weeks old.
- Four weeks after the rabies vaccination, we arrange for you a passing rabies titer blood test result ( $\geq 0.5$  IU/ml) by an approved lab in Germany. This test is obligatory to enter the European Union with dogs and cats. After test result, three month quarantine in the country of origin is required.
- If necessary, we can also shelter your pet in one of our foster care homes during the quarantine.
- We support you in obtaining the obligatory pet's health certificate endorsed by a government vet at least ten days before the flight.
- We can assist with any boarding needs you may have prior to, during, or after your flight. We can help you choose the most suitable airline carrier, make reservations and book your pet's ticket in the cabin or hold.
